
This is in response to your letter of April 24, 1981, to Ronald W. Haughton, Chairman of the Foreign Service Labor Relations Board, where you, in effect, request reconsideration of a decision and order of the Employee-Management Relations Commission (Case No. S-E-5 (April 1, 1980)). Pursuant to your request, deliberations on this matter were restricted to the Members of the Foreign Service Labor Relations Board.

We have given careful consideration to your request, reviewing the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Decision and Order, the exceptions to that Decision and Order, the Decision and Order of the Employee-Management Relations Commissions, the brief filed by the American Foreign Service Association in opposition to your request for review and your reply brief.

In the Board's view, your request provides no persuasive reason for reconsideration of the Commission decision. Accordingly, the Board denies the request for reconsideration.
